
## WHO WE ARE

Monthly workshops and personalized financial and entrepreneurial coaching appointments as well as weekly informational sessions at the Mexican Consulate, and monthly workshops about how to start a business in partnership with the LSBDC GNOR and the HCCL Foundation

## **Camino Financiero** (4 Workshops & 2+ Coaching Appointments)

8-week financial wellness accelerator program that educates clients in understanding credit, credit scores, debt management, repayment, and savings strategies. #### Impúlsate (6 Workshops & 2+ Coaching Appointments)

6-week accelerator program for established entrepreneurs seeking to grow or scale their construction or janitorial business. Attendees learn how to formalize their business legally, attract customers and create a digital presence, provide a bid or estimate, gain an overview of legal and insurance requirements, cash flow management principles, hiring basics and the benefits of obtaining government validated certifications.
